Extension Study Group aims to establish a voluntarily knowledge sharing and learning environment that fosters professional growth for extension officers at the individual and organizational level, serving as the groundwork for agricultural and rural development.

The study group was instrumental in developing the capacity of extension workers and contributed greatly in improving the quality of agricultural services.

#### 5. Highlight recommendation

A renewed capability building strategy in order to invigorate the group as well as to strengthen its qualitative aspects.

### Introduction

- In 1997, extension public officials in Korea were converted to local officers, resulting to gaps in communication and information exchange between local extension institutes as well as decline in cooperation between the central and local government business systems.
- Acknowledging the increasing impact of extension activities in the
  agricultural sector, the Rural Development Administration (RDA) formed
  the extension study group to foster a self-directed and participatory
  approach to learning and knowledge sharing between extension officers.
  It is an autonomic study community at the national level that provides an
  avenue for professional skills improvement while strengthening
  knowledge sharing and coordination between central and local
  government.
- Main activities under the program include: project activity (3 times for each study group); education to acquire post-graduate academic degree or professional certificate; fostering and supporting farmer's study community for field application of new technology; providing technology information between and among members; field consultation with farmer; and participation to related seminars to capacitate members.
- The project links RDA government officers across the entire republic of Korea, with a total of 2,536 members from 55 different fields since its establishment in 1996.
